Highlander's 60-unit, independent senior living housing development neared completion by year-end 2020. Individuals 62+ will move to in Highlander's newest addition by February 2021.











# The Connect powered by COX

The Highlander Accelerator's technology lab and digital library proved to be an asset in a year with high demand on digital access. The Connect's classroom additionally supported Seventy Five North's partnership with Prairie STEM, a local nonprofit with a mission to advance youth access to science and engineering programs. Prairie STEM called The Connect home as they created STEM kits for OPS students to encourage exploration and creativity.

# Do School

In partnership with Howard Kennedy Elementary School and Metropolitan Community College, Do School was created in the Highlander Accelerator to serve the unique needs of North Omaha students dealing with the challenges of virtual learning. The tuition free program offered rotating groups of students access to in-person instruction and tutoring, internet access, breakfast, lunch and camaraderie.

# Drive Through Career Fair To support North Omaha's u

To support North Omaha's urgent workforce development needs, Seventy Five North teamed up with EmployOMA, Metropolitan Community College, Heartland Hope Mission, the Omaha Housing Authority, Catholic Charities and Salem Baptist Church to administer a drive-through career fair. Employment information was provided to attendees in addition to food boxes, candidate information, voter registration packets and COVID-19 safety information.




# **EDUCATE**

Seventy Five North partnered with Omaha Public Schools in 2015 to strengthen and help support Howard Kennedy Elementary School. At the five year mark, Howard Kennedy has seen steady improvements in state test scores in math, reading and science, an advanced project-based learning curriculum, positive changes to school culture and parent relations, and strong teacher retention rates. The school is led by longtime educator, Tony Gunter, who is a proven instructional leader and Highlander neighborhood advocate.









## ACT Prep at Highlander

In partnership with Aim High Test Prep, Seventy Five North offered a second year of ACT test preparation through a 10-week course for students either living in a North Omaha zip code or attending a nearby high school. 13 students prepared for the December 2020 exam through virtual classes, limited in-person instruction and tutoring.


### Omaha Early Learning Center at Kennedy


# **New Team Member**
