## **MIXED-INCOME** HOUSING

### **A Vision Realized, A Community Transformed**

In 2024, Seventy-Five North celebrated the completion of Highlander's original multi-family residential development strategy with the addition of Davis Ridge. This achievement marks not just years of dedicated planning and execution but the realization of a vision rooted in a simple yet powerful belief: high-quality, mixedincome housing can be a catalyst for community transformation.

Since the first residents moved in, Highlander has become more than a collection of buildings--it has become a home. Children ride their bikes down safe streets, neighbors form bonds over shared experiences, and a sense of community continues to grow. The completion of Davis Ridge adds another chapter to this story, offering more families the opportunity to live in a vibrant, supportive neighborhood.

### **Davis Ridge**

Seventy-Five North, in partnership with Brinshore Development, has completed Davis Ridge, the fifth and final phase of Highlander's original multi-family rental housing development plan. Located at the west end of 31st and Patrick streets, Davis Ridge introduces **41 high-guality** apartment units, further expanding housing opportunities for families and individuals in the Highlander neighborhood.

### Single-Family, **For-Sale Housing**

In collaboration with Blair Freeman and various local contractors, Seventy-Five North completed the construction of eight homes in the Highlander neighborhood.

### **Neighborhood Mural**

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In partnership with local art group LaLa, Seventy-Five North and partners had the opportunity to work with four talented local artists to create a mural for the neighborhood's Burdette and Wade development that celebrates and emulates the vibrant spirit of the Highlander community.

## **EDUCATION**

### **Unlocking Potential** and Preparing for Possibilities

For many families, summer presents a challenge. Recognizing this gap, Seventy-Five North developed a summer tutoring program at Highlander, offering free, high-quality learning just steps from residents' doors.

In 2024, the program:

- Served 18 elementary students
- Provided daily lessons in reading and math, taught by Howard Kennedy Elementary teachers
- Offered daily enrichment activities from community partners

Of those enrolled, 86% maintained or improved their reading and math scores from spring to fall, preventing typical summer setbacks. Additionally, two incoming kindergartners started school above grade level in reading and met or exceeded expectations in math.

"This program truly builds such a strong sense of community and fosters quality relationships between Kennedy teachers, neighborhood students, and their peers. These relationships help them not only improve academically but also encourage positive classroom behavior throughout the school year. They are always asking when tutoring will begin again!"

By eliminating barriers and providing high-quality instruction in a setting that feels like home, Highlander's youngest residents are empowered to thrive-both in the classroom and beyond.



In its ninth year of reconstitution through a Community Partnership Agreement between Omaha Public Schools (OPS) and Seventy-Five North, Howard Kennedy has shown remarkable growth in both learning outcomes and student enrollment. In 2024, the school earned its second Apple Distinguished School award, which will be held from 2024 to 2027.

### **IMPACT AT A GLANCE: HOWARD KENNEDY**

Reading Rank: Since 2016-2017, Kennedy has improved its reading scores ranking from 60th out of 60 OPS elementary schools to 37th.

72% of Kennedy 5th graders scored proficient or above on the state science assessment.

**Mobility Rate:** Decreased by 23.3%\*

### **Nourishment Nook**

Starting in the 2024-2025 school year, Seventy-Five North is proud to support the Nourishment Nook at Howard Kennedy, a program focused on providing fresh, perishable food to neighborhood families. In the first four months of the school year, 158 food distributions were delivered to families.

### **ACT Preparation Seminar**

In collaboration with Aim High Test Prep, Seventy-Five North hosted a six-week seminar to prepare a cohort of 8 North Omaha high school juniors and seniors for their college entrance exams. By the end of the program, 100% of participants who completed the pre- and post- questionnaire felt more prepared for the ACT, and two-thirds reported increased confidence in their readiness for college.

# COMMUNITY HEALTH AND WELLNESS

### **Connecting and Collaborating: Highlander Resident Committee**

A thriving neighborhood is built through collaboration, shared vision, and strong resident leadership. In 2024, Seventy-Five North and neighbors worked together to establish a consistent, intentional engagement platform, empowering residents to coauthor the future of Highlander. This initiative, the Highlander Resident Committee, encourages residents to identify priorities, shape programs, and actively contribute to the neighborhood's growth and well-being.

In its first year, the Resident Committee focused on understanding Highlander celebrating its strengths while identifying opportunities for improvement. Members supported community programs and events, fostered relationships with Highlander businesses and organizations, and began laying the groundwork for new resident-led initiatives.

"I joined the Resident Committee to see how we can rebuild this area. We're here because we want to draw neighbors in and show them that this area is changing. We want to show them that we can make decisions to improve it, but it takes the entire community."

### **Highlander Community Day**

2024 marked the biggest Highlander Community Day yet! With an estimated **700+ attendees** and over **30 community partners**, Seventy-Five North was proud to celebrate the progress of the Highlander community alongside neighbors.

### Highlander Wellness Expo

Seventy-Five North partnered with No More Empty Pots, the University of Nebraska Medical Center, and Nebraska Medicine to kick off the summer with a neighborhood wellness event. The event brought together **23 community partners** to connect with neighbors, providing essential health and wellness resources while highlighting the interconnectedness of physical, mental, and community well-being.

### Outdoor Fitness at Highlander

From June through September, Seventy-Five North hosted **28 free MixxedFit** and **Yoga classes** open to the community. Attendance averaged **34 participants for MixxedFit** and **36 for Yoga**.

### **Kids Cruisin' Kitchen**

In partnership with the Salvation Army, the Kids Cruisin' Kitchen program offered free summer lunches at Highlander, ensuring all children had access to nutritious meals at no cost to families.









# **ECONOMIC VITALITY**

### **Fueling Economic Opportunity for Local Entrepreneurs**

Highlander Marketplace is more than a neighborhood market it's a platform for economic opportunity. By supporting local farmers and small business owners, it helps entrepreneurs expand their reach, grow sustainable businesses, and create economic inclusion.

In partnership with Whispering Roots, Big Garden, and Charles Drew Health Center, the marketplace makes fresh, locally grown food accessible to more neighbors by accepting EBT, WIC, and senior vouchers, while boosting revenue for farmers.

The marketplace also offers a space for local entrepreneurs to test and grow their businesses. In 2024, 15 vendors showcased handmade goods, specialty foods, and other products. To encourage participation and boost sales, Seventy-Five North provides Highlander Bucks, which guests can redeem as credit toward purchases at the market.

By connecting small businesses with customers and lowering barriers to entrepreneurship, Highlander Marketplace strengthens the local economy, fosters financial mobility, and empowers the next generation of business owners.



### **Employer Spotlights**

Heartland Workforce Solutions and Seventy-Five North have teamed up to present weekly Employer Spotlights—an opportunity for jobseekers to meet with hiring employers, connect with workforce experts, and receive a free resume review. Each spotlight event features a local hiring employer and is hosted at the Highlander Dining Room.

### Part-time and Seasonal Job Fair

In partnership with Heartland Workforce Solutions, the Urban League of Nebraska, and the Omaha Housing Authority, Seventy-Five North hosted a successful Part-Time and Seasonal Job Fair at Highlander. Over 100 jobseekers attended, ready to connect with 13 local employers.



### **Makers Market at Howard Kennedy**

As part of Howard Kennedy's school-wide projectbased learning curriculum, Seventy-Five North was proud to support the Makers Market. This event showcased months of hard work by K-5 students as they built their own businesses—from business planning and product development to logo design and communication strategies. Students had the opportunity to sell their products while developing essential business skills such as crafting sales pitches and handling transactions.





### CNI CHOICE NEIGHBORHOODS IMPLEMENTATION GRANT

### Partnering for Progress: Shaping the Future of North 30th Street

In 2024, Seventy-Five North gathered with residents, partners, and community leaders to celebrate the continued progress of the Choice Neighborhoods Implementation (CNI) Grant along the North 30th Street Corridor. Hosted at the former site of Spencer Homes, the event honored the neighborhood's past and affirmed a shared vision for its future—one focused on transformation that goes beyond buildings, empowering people to shape their choices and aspirations.

Through collaboration with the City of Omaha, Brinshore Development, and the Omaha Housing Authority, we remain committed to creating a neighborhood where residents have access to high-quality housing and opportunities to build a better future.

### Year 5 of the CNI Grant

In collaboration with the City of Omaha, the Omaha Housing Authority, and Brinshore Development, Seventy-Five North was proud to work alongside former residents of Spencer Homes in the fifth year of the Choice Neighborhoods Implementation Grant.

### **Community Conversations**

The North 30th team partnered with local community development agency, Heartland Next, to facilitate a series of engaging conversations that empowered community members to shape the naming and branding of the two phases of Spencer Homes' redevelopment. Through these discussions, the identities of the buildings were born: Malcolm's Place and MLK Square.

### **Spencer Homes Redevelopment**

The first phase of Spencer Homes' redevelopment, Malcolm's Place, welcomed its inaugural residents in 2024. With a blend of townhomes, apartments, and commercial spaces, the development will open its doors to more neighbors as construction wraps up in 2025. The second and final phase of the redevelopment also broke ground in 2024. Once completed, the two phases will introduce a total of **140 mixed-income rental units** along with commercial amenities.

### **Curb Appeal Program**

The Curb Appeal Program offers homeowners in the North 30th Street area the opportunity to apply for funding to enhance the exterior of their homes. In 2024, a total of **\$260,620** was distributed among **14 homeowners**, enhancing both individual properties and the broader community.
